**Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium® Partners with
United Way of the Midlands and 2-1-1 Hotline for Third Year**

Omaha, Neb. (October 1, 2018) – Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium is partnering with United Way of the Midlands and the 2-1-1 Helpline to provide free household memberships to eligible families for the "Bring Your Family to the Zoo" program. This is the third year of the program.

The "Bring Your Family to the Zoo" program is focused on creating family and community engagement in hopes of improving academic achievement. This year, third grade students in 44 area Omaha-Council Bluffs metro schools with an 80% or higher free or reduced lunch rate are eligible for the program. By receiving a free household membership, families are able to participate in a variety of educational programs and activities offered by Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium.

The secondary purpose of the program is to educate schools and families about the 2-1-1 Helpline's capacity to help families in crisis find local support. 2-1-1 is a free, community resource helpline, which provides information and offers referrals to food pantries, counseling, utility assistance and other human service programs. Families at participating schools may call 2-1-1 Monday through Friday 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Saturday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to request their membership through October 31.

In 2017, Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium provided 1,100 families from Omaha Public Schools, Council Bluffs Community Schools and Archdiocese of Omaha Schools free household memberships through the "Bring Your Family to the Zoo" program. A total of 45 schools participated in the program last year. This year's goal is to provide more than 2,000 memberships to eligible families.
